4. Karnatak Ayurved Vidyapeeth, Khasbag, Belgaum.

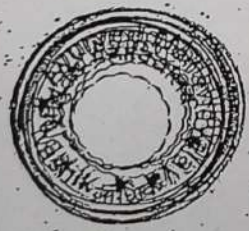
